### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

David Sparrow and Theresa Tova reported that Bill 17 finally became law, the first piece of legislation in ACTRA's 75 year history that ACTRA has seen through to Royal Assent. This work began 20 years ago. The Bill had been brought forward four times on our behalf.

Sue Milling and Art Hindle reported on the debate at Third Reading. It demonstrates what endless lobbying can do.

David Sparrow spoke of how art and artists make a difference; and how collective action can bring about progressive change for all performers. He expressed gratitude for the passionate and hardworking Councillors acting on behalf of the membership.

Bill 17 will take effect in February 2016 – nine months after it receives Royal Assent.

Ms Milling said that work with the Ministry of Labour will ensure that housekeeping amendments are made to help in the implementation of the Bill as well as working with the Ministry on the education of inspectors.

Mr. Sparrow thanked staff for their work over the years.

Mr. Sparrow reported on the Provincial Budget/Ontario Tax Credits; his appearance on Business News Network talking about domestic and foreign service productions; the Casting ACTRA website; IPA focus groups; AFBS and the formation of the Healthy Artists Trust and the lobbying of government to give a grant for seniors when they buy additional coverage; Scrabble with the Stars in support of PAL; the National Executive meeting in Vancouver; and the Writers Guild of Canada's Screenwriting Awards at Koerner Hall which was hosted by Ryan Belville.

Mr. Sparrow also reported on his attendance at two Liberal events last week where he met with Liberal House Leader Yasir Naqvi and Minister of Labour, Kevin Flynn.

The ACTRA/Equity relationship discussions continue.
